Not all AI is the same. The use of artificial intelligence (AI) has become indispensable today in most professions and also in everyday personal life. But AI is not flawless either and, above all, different AI assistants work in different ways. This is shown by a comparison of ChatGPT, Claude and Grok in connection with questions about Israel and antisemitism. Thinker and bridge-builder. The former British Chief Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, who died in 2020, was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II for his services to the community and to interfaith dialogue, and was later appointed to the House of Lords. He is regarded as one of the great Jewish thinkers of the late 20th and early 21st centuries.
